Job Summary

Reporting to the Director of Research and Transfer, the selected candidate will be responsible for research activities involving quantitative methods, in collaboration with other team members. In addition to his/her main tasks, the person may be involved in projects involving mixed methods or collaborative or participatory research methods, particularly in the context of program evaluation mandates.

Main Duties and Responsibilities

- Act as a resource person within the team on quantitative research methods (sampling, types of statistical analyses, data collection procedures, questionnaire and survey development, measurement scales, etc.);
- Explore administrative data sources and public data access issues and develop processes for using administrative and public data in the education and health sectors;
- Construct appropriate quantitative research designs, develop quantitative data collection tools and analyze data;
- Supervise students in quantitative research activities;
